Volunteers were assisted through **American Red Cross, Sandhills Chapter's** three funded programs.



**2,167**

Uninsured Cumberland County residents helped by **Better Health's** three funded programs.



**13,424**

Cumberland County residents received services from **Fayetteville Urban Ministry.**




**NC 2-1-1** **135,217** individuals received information and/or referrals through the hotline.




Youth Growth Stock Trust granted **\$325,000** for schools, scholarships and non-profits



**418**  homeless single women (with or without children) were provided programs and services to overcome barriers that have led to chronic instability and homelessness through **Connections of Cumberland County.**

**Girl Scouts, NC Coastal Pines Council** provided **1,046**  girls program opportunities in the following areas: self-esteem building programs; Uniquely ME! Program; and Connecting with Confidence program.

**769** **Cumberland County CommuniCare, Inc.** provided family focused services for **769** at-risk and court involved youth, adults and their families in Cumberland County.

**Vision Resource Center**  provided **135** individuals with recreational, educational and social programs designed to address their needs through the Adult & Youth Healthy Living and Wellness Programs.

**Dolly Parton Imagination Library Initiative** delivered over **411,568** books to the homes of children since beginning in 2005.
