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United Way of Cumberland County Announces 2019/2020 Allocations to Community Partner Agencies Funded Programs

Fayetteville, NC (August 5, 2019) – United Way of Cumberland County is pleased to announce its' 2019/2020 allocations to fund over 59 programs and services provided by 18 Community Partner Agencies. United Way is committed to lasting change right here in Cumberland County and we do this by collaborating with other non-profit agencies that have the same goal: to measurably improve the quality of people's lives in our community. Each year United Way of Cumberland County calls upon the citizens of our great county to contribute to our campaign in order to enable us to fund programs and services that solve critical issues facing our community. In general these issues are Education, Financial Stability, Health and Basic Critical Needs.

UWCC randomly surveys Cumberland County residents to determine critical community issues and based upon the results, United Way partners with organizations that are making an impact on these targeted issues. It takes the entire community working together to create real, lasting change and not just quick fixes, and that is why UWCC Community Partners are so important. UWCC also knows how important it is to investors that their dollars are put to good use. Therefore, volunteers from the community work together to formulate the UWCC Community Impact Council and Community Impact Review Panels. These volunteers are assigned funded programs to review and evaluate. The Community Impact Council makes recommendations to UWCC's Board of Directors on how funds should be allocated. The Board of Directors approves the final allocation to our Community Partners' funded programs and services. Following are the 2019/2020 UWCC funded programs and services.
